- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Accelerating the Devel-
- 5 opment of Advanced Psychology Trainees Act" or the
- 6 "ADAPT Act".

1	SEC. 2. COVERAGE AND CODING FOR QUALIFIED PSYCHOL-
2	OGIST SERVICES FURNISHED BY ADVANCED
3	PSYCHOLOGY TRAINEES UNDER THE MEDI-
4	CARE PROGRAM.
5	(a) Coverage.—
6	(1) In general.—Section 1861(ii) of the So-
7	cial Security Act (42 U.S.C. 1395x(ii)) is amend-
8	ed
9	(A) by inserting "(1)" after "(ii)";
10	(B) in paragraph (1), as added by para-
11	graph (1) of this section, by inserting "(or fur-
12	nished by an advanced psychology trainee under
13	the general supervision of a clinical psychologist
14	(as so defined) and billed by the supervising
15	psychologist)" after "(as defined by the Sec-
16	retary)"; and
17	(C) by adding at the end the following new
18	paragraph:

20	"(A) The term 'advanced psychology trainee'
21	means—
22	"(i) a doctoral intern who is completing a
23	required period of supervised experiential train-
24	ing through a program accredited by the Amer-
25	ican Psychological Association, not less than

1 one year in duration, before being awarded a 2 doctoral degree; or 3 "(ii) a postdoctoral resident who has ob-4 tained a doctoral degree in psychology, is seeking a license to practice psychology, and is en-5 6 gaged in a 1- or 2- year period of additional supervised experiential training to acquire the 7 8 skills or hours required for licensure through a 9 program accredited by the American Psychological Association or a member of the Associa-10 11 tion of Psychology Postdoctoral and Internship Centers. 12 "(B) The term 'general supervision' means, 13 with respect to a service, that the service is fur-14 15 nished under the overall direction and control of a clinical psychologist (as defined for purposes of 16 paragraph (1)), but the supervising psychologist's 17 presence is not required during the furnishing of the 18 19 service.". (2) Effective date.—The amendments made 20 by this subsection shall apply to services furnished 21 on or after the date that is 1 year after the date of 22 the enactment of this Act. 23 (b) DEVELOPMENT OF GC MODIFIER CODE.—Not 24 25 later than 1 year after the date of the enactment of this

1 Act, the Secretary of Health and Human Services shall develop a "GC" modifier code to identify and accurately bill for services furnished by an advanced psychology trainee pursuant to the amendments made by subsection 5 (a). SEC. 3. GUIDANCE TO STATES ON COVERAGE OF SERVICES 7 BY ADVANCED **PSYCHOLOGY PROVIDED** 8 TRAINEES UNDER MEDICAID AND CHIP. 9 Not later than 1 year after the date of enactment of this Act, the Secretary of Health and Human Services shall issue and disseminate guidance to States on strategies to overcome existing barriers to coverage of services furnished by advanced psychology trainees (as defined under section 1861(ii)(2) of the Social Security Act, as added by section 2(a), through the Medicaid program under title XIX of the Social Security Act (42 U.S.C. 1396 et seq.) and the Children's Health Insurance Program under title XXI of such Act (42 U.S.C. 1397aa et seg.). Such guidance shall include technical assistance and best practices regarding each of the following: (1) Recommended legal mechanisms for acti-21 vating coverage of services furnished by advanced 22 psychology trainees under such programs. 23
